

Reinforced autoclaved aerated concrete at Royal Bolton Hospital

In November we identified RAAC (reinforced autoclaved aerated concrete) on our hospital site and have since taken a number of measures to ensure the safety of our patients, their loved ones and our staff.

The affected areas have been decanted to allow for maintenance teams to carry out their work, while a full survey of the hospital site continues.

National maternity survey praises **Bolton pregnancy care**

Findings from a survey of more than 600 women who gave birth in 2023 show that they think our staff are amongst the best care providers in Greater Manchester during pregnancy.

The survey involved 121 NHS Trusts in England and is designed to build an understanding of the risk and quality of maternity services and care.

It highlights women's views on all aspects of their maternity care from the first time they see a clinician or midwife, through to the care provided at home in the weeks following the arrival of their baby.

Celebrating our fantastic staff

On Friday 24 November hundreds of our healthcare workers were celebrated at our annual sponsored staff awards, the For a Better Bolton Awards. 18 winners were revealed after judges had the difficult job of reading through a record 827 inspirational nominations that had been submitted by staff and patients.

This year our People's Choice winner was sister Mary Hart, who received a standing ovation in recognition of her care and compassion, with dry eyes at a premium in the room as we heard directly from a patient she recently helped.

Tens of thousands of pounds has been raised during the past six months for Our Bolton NHS Charity, helping to make a lasting and meaningful difference.



In October, some of our stroke patients took on a special walking challenge that celebrated their recovery and the progress they have made.

Affectionately nicknamed the 'stroke warriors', ten patients who survived a stroke took part in a sponsored walk on the 400m race track at Leverhulme Park, raising £7,000 for our Community Stroke team.

At Christmas people right across Bolton donated more than £12,000 worth of presents, to help lift the spirits of patients and staff.


We didn't stop there when it came to empowering our patients and communities with vital information about their health and wellbeing.


Seventeen couples or individuals have benefitted from 69 counselling sessions since Our Bolton NHS Charity started funding the pilot with Lighthouses Therapy Services in February 2023.

71% reported a positive change to their relationship following counselling and a significant reduction in their levels of depression and anxiety.

We started 2024 by trialling new animated videos to **improve patient information** about surgical procedures for breast cancer. Funded by Our Bolton NHS Charity, the twelve-month pilot will provide hundreds of patients with access to online videos which explain different breast operations, their benefits and risks, and any alternative management options.



Brand new Community Diagnostic Centre opens Communities across Bolton will benefit from our brand new Community Diagnostic Centre (CDC) that will provide thousands of patients with

quicker access to vital tests and scans. The multi-million-pound investment opened in March, and will create modern health facilities equipped with the latest technology, transforming older parts of the

hospital estate into a state of the art testing facility.

Two MRI scanners and an X-ray scanner have recently been installed to help diagnose thousands of patients for various conditions, ensuring they receive the appropriate care and treatment.







State-of-the-art theatres open

A brand new state-of-the-art theatre complex has opened on our hospital site.

The new £19.6m Elective Care Centre, which opened to patients on Monday 15 January, has four ultra-modern theatres which are being used to help with waiting lists and treat approximately 5,000 patients a year.

As well as the four new theatres, two integrated wards have also been built as part of the development.

Bolton's Institute of Medical Sciences due to open this year

Bolton's Institute of Medical Sciences (IMS), a new medical and clinical skills training facility located at our hospital site, is due to open this year.

IMS will provide unrivalled training opportunities for aspiring and existing healthcare professionals, and is expected to serve as a transformational blueprint for training NHS staff.

A collaborative project between us and the University of Bolton, Bolton College, and Bolton Council, IMS will give people a direct route into clinical healthcare employment.



Making a difference for the people of Bolton

For many years, us at the Trust, Bolton Council, voluntary and community organisations, and our other health partners have worked together on the issues that affect the people of Bolton.

Together, we call ourselves the Bolton Health and Care Partnership, which is a commitment to working closely, understanding our own pieces of the puzzle, and working together to solve problems.

As a partnership, we've been working on our priorities and areas of focus, based on the data we have and what our teams see on a regular basis, to form the next Bolton Locality Plan.

Last year, we visited community groups, public spaces and meetings across the town, as well as sharing an online survey, so that we could understand more about what you, the people of Bolton, needed from health and care services.

Your views helped to form our plans, and have influenced the priorities we have set in the plan.

Our plan sets out how we will work together during the next five years to achieve our priorities, and make meaningful improvements for the people


